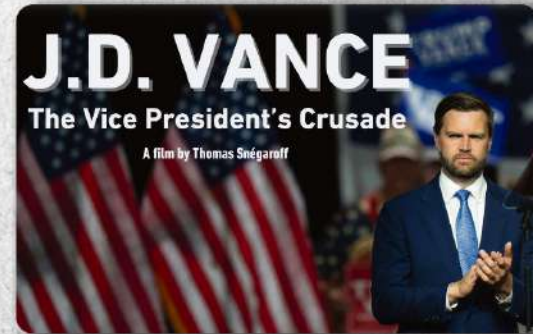

The race of their life

In the heart of the Alps, around the roof of Europe, Laura, Ruth, and Théo, three passionate trail runners, experience the adventure of a lifetime during the 2025 edition of the Ultra-Trail du Mont-Blanc.

Every year in late August, Chamonix hosts a challenge considered impossible: the Ultra-Trail du Mont-Blanc. Created in 2003, this trail race is the most prestigious and legendary in the world. Its concept is unique: at the starting line, the world's top athletes rub shoulders with passionate amateurs to tackle a titanic course spanning 171 km and 10,000 meters of elevation gain across France, Italy, and Switzerland. Over 3 days and 2 nights, the 2,300 participants push their bodies to the limit in the heart of the wilderness, with the iconic Mont Blanc as a backdrop. This documentary delves into the heart of this extraordinary human adventure. Through the perspectives of both champion runners and novices, the film reveals the lesser-known facets of this extreme sport and tells the story of an extraordinary human adventure. A total immersion in what remains, for each of them, the race of their lives.

This cinematic journey captures a man pushing the absolute boundaries of human endurance against the elements. It dives deep into his preparation, revealing the vulnerability and sheer determination of a champion.

What goes through an athlete's mind when he faces extreme conditions? How do you prepare your body for deadly temperatures? How do you train your mind to overcome that pernicious unknown - the cold- that makes you lose all your bearings? And what do you do when it's your head that can't keep up? And what drives man to push back his limits, even at the risk of his life?

For two years, and on several continents, this film followed Nice-based athlete Arthur Guérien-Boeri, freediving prodigy and the most successful Frenchman in his discipline, as he prepared physically and mentally to set two new records in dynamic freediving. From Nice to Canada, via Finland and Paris, a breathtaking odyssey !

In the hell of scam centers

This film is an in-depth, gripping investigation into the multi-billion-dollar scam centers thriving in Southeast Asia, where hundreds of thousands of men and women are violently held captive by criminal syndicates.

These captives come from Asia, Africa, and Europe, lured through social media by promises of lucrative careers in tech. Educated and multilingual, they are targeted specifically for their computer literacy. However, the moment they arrive, the dream turns into a nightmare: violent Chinese syndicates immediately seize their passports and cut them off from the world.

Imprisoned inside heavily guarded compounds, they are forced to work exhausting shifts seven days a week under the constant threat of physical abuse and torture. Their mandatory mission is to operate thousands of fake profiles, deploying sophisticated psychological and romantic manipulation to ensnare global «clients.» Once a deep emotional bond is formed, they manipulate their victims into fraudulent investment and cryptocurrency schemes, systematically draining their bank accounts.

Circles of silence

The Le Scouarnec case

This two-part documentary series explores the omerta surrounding the Le Scouarnec case, one of the largest child abuse scandals in French history, through two parallel yet deeply intertwined spheres: the hospital institution and the private family circle.

«The Medical Circle,» the first installment of the series, investigates the mechanisms of silence at work within the hospital system. It reveals how public hospitals and medical authorities covered for Joël Le Scouarnec following his 2005 conviction for possession of child pornography. Despite this warning sign, he continued to practice without restrictions, protected by institutional inertia and medical corporatism. The episode highlights the systemic failures and the multiple levels of responsibility that allowed Joël Le Scouarnec to continue his crimes with total impunity. «The Family Circle,» the second documentary, explores Joël Le Scouarnec's domestic world. It sheds light on the weight of silence and toxic loyalty within a family confronted with pedophilia. This silence, which became complicit, allowed his criminality to persist even in the operating rooms. These acts could have been stopped, and many assaults avoided, if only someone had spoken up. The film reveals the gears of psychological grip and secrecy that prevent victims from speaking out and loved ones from hearing them. Every suspicion was brushed aside; every word was silenced or downplayed. This silence was not just a refusal to see, but a collective defense mechanism where the unspeakable remained hidden to preserve the family's image. This second film interrogates the weight of denial, family loyalty, and the dizzying sting of betrayal. Mirrored against one another, these two parts recount a single tragedy: that of a double-sided silence, the institution and the clan, which together made the unthinkable possible.

After countless documentaries about victims, this is the next step: the opioid epidemic, told by the very perpetrators. A story that blurs the lines between global pharma and crime networks. Marketing directors of some labs who spent time in jail are now ready to share their memories and tell how ruthless their methods were : exotic dancers, corruption, booze...

This is the inside story of a toxic business that has killed 800,000 Americans and has been slowly spreading worldwide. The opioid epidemic was originally triggered by the corporate greed of the US pharma industry. What started in boardroom meetings as a highly aggressive marketing campaign for prescription painkillers soon mutated into an uncontrollable public health crisis. Seizing a massive new market of addicts, Mexican cartels then picked up the Fentanyl production, flooding the streets with a substance fifty times more potent than heroin.

This film will give voice to corporate executives and criminals. They are talking either because they entered a redemption process or because they were summoned by congressmen or attorneys in front of cameras. We got our hands on hours of precious video footage from hearings and interrogatories. We can finally have a fascinating look into the inner dealings of the biggest crime of the century.

Interpol is an institution with 195 member countries whose mission is to promote collaboration between police authorities to create a safer world! Some member countries such as China, Russia, Iran have been using Interpol's network to hunt down human rights activists and political opponents...

Their names are Idris, Chao, Ali, Haroo, José... These men and women are English, American, French, Chinese, Turkish, Bahraini, Emirati, Egyptian, Russian, Iranian... Several hundred of them have been rotting in prison for months, tortured, living in fear and forced to keep silent. Some are political dissidents, human rights activists, members of religious or ethnic minorities... Others are businessmen and women who have simply had the misfortune to overshadow an influential competitor or to have refused to pay bribes. All are victims of the dysfunction of the world's second largest organization after the UN: Interpol. Autocrats and corrupt regimes have weaponized the agency's «Red Notices» to track down their enemies far beyond their own borders. By turning a blind eye to these abuses, the international police organization has inadvertently become an instrument of transnational oppression. This film exposes how a system designed to catch world-class criminals is now being used to crush innocent lives.

In the United States, university campuses have become the scene of an ideological war between students that is fracturing American society. Faced with the militant intolerance of American academics, America is watching in awe as Generation Z seeks to erase the world of its elders, and whose vote will weigh heavily in the choice of the next President of the United States.

Israeli-Palestinian conflict, abortion, LGBT rights: between wokism and conservatism, two camps are clashing among students. How do you explain such a split in the universities? Wokist ideology, obsessed with the injustices suffered by ethnic minorities, makes shortcuts between First Amendment freedom of expression, the Middle East conflict, and Black Lives Matter. It casts the Jew as the white oppressor on a par with early settlers or American slaveholders, a rhetoric that is rampant on TikTok, relayed by influencers, and now found on the outskirts of campuses. This digital echo chamber has effectively shut down nuanced debate, replacing dialogue with a culture of cancellation and intimidation. As lines are drawn in the sand, university administrations find themselves paralyzed, caught between protecting free speech and managing ideological warfare. The campus has transformed from a sanctuary of learning into a polarized ideological battleground.

Through the story of Jennifer Ringley, this film delves into the early Web of the 1990s to explore what drives girls to film themselves, and the world to watch them. Is it superficial or revolutionary? A feminist approach or the new clothes of self-objectification? Liberating or alienating? By revisiting the birth of JenniCam, the documentary uncovers the blueprint of our modern digital existence. It reveals how a lone pioneer inadvertently predicted the attention economy, influencer culture, and the blur between public and private life that defines today's social media.

In the 1990s, an American student decided on a whim to film her daily life and put it online, thus becoming the first camgirl in history. At the height of her popularity, JenniCam's site attracted up to 100 million visitors a week, she was interviewed on national TV and crystallized the fears and debates sparked by the arrival of the Web in our daily lives : some saw in it the advent of a narcissistic culture obsessed with spectacle, others the emergence of a new way of talking about oneself and creating links with strangers. In 2003, JenniCam closed her site for good. Since then, she has deserted the Internet. Yet since her retirement, her descendants have conquered the world: girls who film their lives and interact with strangers rule the Web and social media, from vloggers and youtubers to tiktokers of all ages.

The weaker sex America wages war against its women

The film exposes how a resurgence of religious extremism and sexist laws are turning America into the world's leading jailer of women. It shatters the myth of American liberty by revealing the systemic erosion of bodily autonomy.

This documentary reveals the shocking reality of women's rights in the United States. Despite its image as a beacon of freedom, the US imprisons more women than any other country, driven by sexist laws and a resurgence of religious extremism. From forced marriage to the criminalization of pregnancy, we witness the erosion of women's rights in the heartland, exploring the stories of those impacted and the fight for resistance. The film exposes a frightening legal machinery where miscarriages are treated as crime scenes and vulnerable minors are legally bound to abusers under the guise of parental consent. This institutional violence disproportionately targets low-income women and minorities, trapping them in a cycle of poverty and incarceration. By connecting the dots between political battlegrounds and everyday lives, the investigation uncovers a systematic dismantling of bodily autonomy. It is an urgent wake-up call regarding a democracy in crisis, where basic human rights are being rewritten by the judiciary.

150 years ago, there was no such thing as a woman running. Back then, it was impossible for her to imagine "abandoning" her husband and children at dawn on a Sunday morning, to take time out for herself, to remember that she had a body, that it belonged to her and that she could do with it as she pleased. Today, these women can be seen in our cities, our countryside and our sports fields. But who are they? What obstacles have they had to overcome to achieve their freedom? What risks did they take to gain the right to govern their own bodies? Aren't they contributing to the evolution of male/ female relations in our societies? Is sport really a shared, open, mixed space, where men and women can access and appear on an equal footing?

Mothers in struggle

This is the story of the mothers who denounce the sexual violence committed by their (ex-)spouses against their children, and while trying to protect them, find themselves convicted of child nonrepresentation. Even as they dare to break the silence, they are faced with an impossible choice: leave their child in the hands of their abuser, or take the law into their own hands, sometimes risking their lives, to ensure their safety. There are those who remain silent about the violence suffered by their children, fearing that the state will take them away. Those who have to cope with legal proceedings and endure institutional abuse. These women each struggle in their own way, driven by the hope that the recent liberation of speech will change the way society looks at them.

Until the appeal, the double punishment of a father follows the struggle of a family to prove the innocence of a man accused of causing the death of his baby. Faced with rigid medical dogmas and a system that refuses to back down, this ordinary family turns into a team of investigators to challenge the state's accusations. Their journey becomes a race against time to prevent a tragic medical misunderstanding from destroying what is left of their lives. A deeply moving film that reveals the cold violence of relentless justice.

Alexandre is in court for the second time. He is accused of shaking his baby 9 years ago, causing its death. In the initial trial, Alexandre was unanimously found not guilty. But the public prosecutor's office appealed, and Alexandre is now awaiting his second trial. Since the tragedy, his whole life, and his family's, has revolved around legal deadlines. Between fear and determination, he has become the investigator of his own story, fighting for the truth and proving his innocence. For nearly a decade, the sword of Damocles has hung over his head, tearing his family apart and freezing their lives in a state of perpetual limbo. As he steps back into the courtroom, he is not just fighting for his freedom, but to finally be allowed to grieve the son he lost.

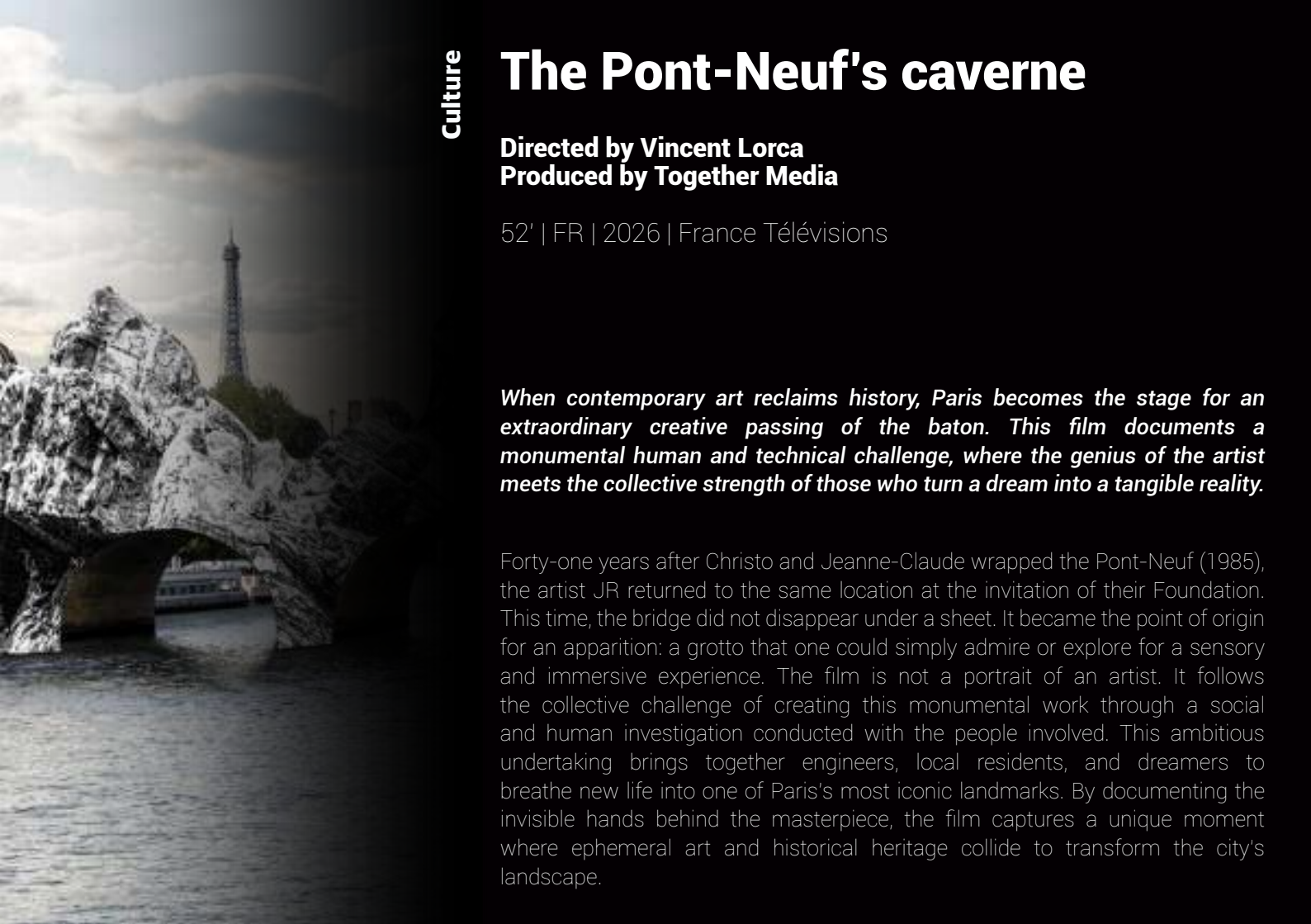
The Pont-Neuf's caverne

When contemporary art reclaims history, Paris becomes the stage for an extraordinary creative passing of the baton. This film documents a monumental human and technical challenge, where the genius of the artist meets the collective strength of those who turn a dream into a tangible reality.

Forty-one years after Christo and Jeanne-Claude wrapped the Pont-Neuf (1985), the artist JR returned to the same location at the invitation of their Foundation. This time, the bridge did not disappear under a sheet. It became the point of origin for an apparition: a grotto that one could simply admire or explore for a sensory and immersive experience. The film is not a portrait of an artist. It follows the collective challenge of creating this monumental work through a social and human investigation conducted with the people involved. This ambitious undertaking brings together engineers, local residents, and dreamers to breathe new life into one of Paris's most iconic landmarks. By documenting the invisible hands behind the masterpiece, the film captures a unique moment where ephemeral art and historical heritage collide to transform the city's landscape.

Art on the run

«On October 19, 2025, a daylight heist at the Louvre Museum shocked the world.» In a brazen seven-minute operation, a commando unit breached the historic Apollo Gallery, escaping with royal crown jewels valued at €88 million. This high-stakes documentary thriller unravels how the world's most secure museum could be so easily compromised. It is a global investigation into the fragile boundaries separating priceless human history from international crime.

The investigation soon exposed a staggering web of security vulnerabilities, revealing that even global institutions are dangerously unprotected. By tracking the dark networks of the global art market, now the third-largest illicit trade after drugs and weapons, the film explores if these treasures were melted down or bought by a shadow collector. Drawing parallels to the infamous 2010 Paris Museum of Modern Art theft, the documentary reveals how cultural heritage has become a disposable currency. Through an immersive blend of CCTV footage and exclusive interviews with international investigators, the narrative transcends the heist itself. Ultimately, it poses a haunting question to the global market: how do we protect our collective memory when the past can vanish in seven minutes?

Hokusai

Impressions of the Rising Sun

"The Great Wave off Kanagawa" is Hokusai's most famous print. But its creator, like the rest of his prolific body of work, has remained in the shadow of this now iconic image. Yet the unique work of this "old fool of drawing," as he called himself, deserves our attention.

Landscape prints, including the iconic Thirty-Six Views of Mount Fuji series to which The Great Wave off Kanagawa belongs, sit alongside other sublime representations of life, forming a dazzling collection that captures the fleeting beauty of the floating world. This vast body of work revolutionized the perception of nature, blending traditional Japanese techniques with a pioneering use of perspective.

Discovered by Europe, and in particular by French artistic circles shortly after his death in 1849, Hokusai fascinated Western masters with his bold, fluid lines and the vibrant, unprecedented colors of his woodblock prints, notably his signature Prussian blue. He became a primary catalyst for the Japonisme movement, serving as a profound source of inspiration for Impressionists and Post-Impressionists alike, such as Monet, Degas, Cézanne, Van Gogh, and Bonnard, who found in his work a new way of seeing and framing reality. This artistic shockwave forever altered the course of modern art, cementing his legacy and gaining him enduring worldwide fame.

"Yael Naim – A New Soul" takes the opposite tack to the standard biopic. It gradually paints a portrait of a free woman in mid-life who questions her choices and the promises she made in her youth: 'Have you become the person you promised yourself you would be?' Through this intimate and universal journey, the film transcends the framework of the musical documentary. It questions the balance between creation and motherhood, the desire for the absolute and everyday anchoring, artistic identity and social pressures, whether they come from patriarchy or matriarchy. With modesty, poetry and intensity, the film captures an inner voice that tries to remain true to itself, to assert its independence and to spread its wings, whatever the cost, whatever the price to pay.

Michel Gondry Do it yourself !

Punk teenager daydreaming himself as Méliès, Michel created in three decades an imperfect body of work: admirable, fascinating and poetic. The brilliant French underground video clipper who became an American filmmaker, knew how to escape the Hollywood trap however, because his cinema lives elsewhere. Because Michel lives only in his dreams. Welcome to the handmade marginal universe of an image magician. Rejecting digital green screens, he prefers the charm of cardboard sets, optical illusions, and stop-motion animation to build his stories. This organic, lo-fi approach allowed him to direct cinematic masterpieces and legendary music videos with the same childlike wonder. In a sanitized industry, he remains one of the last true artisans of the silver screen.

The Russian military archives in Moscow are a secret place strictly closed to the public, operating as a classified fortress of state secrets. Even leading international historians are only granted access in exceptional circumstances, following months of bureaucratic vetting. These vaults contain major historical documents relating to World War II—ranging from high-level Soviet intelligence reports to the personal belongings of the Nazi elite. Most notably, they house the priceless spoils of war seized by the Red Army during the chaotic storming of Adolf Hitler's bunker in Berlin in early May 1945. Preserved in near-perfect condition, these private diaries, strategic blueprints, and internal memos offer an unvarnished look into the psychological collapse and the structural machinery of the Nazi regime during its final days. By gaining unprecedented access to these restricted rooms, this 52-minute historical investigative documentary declassifies and reveals archives of major historical value to the general public for the very first time. Through expert analysis and breathtaking close-ups, the film brings the past into the present, starting with one of the bunker's most mysterious artifacts: Hitler's personal "golden book."



Volodymyr lost a leg at the Front and is now trying to qualify for the Paris Paralympics. Marya's father is at the Front and hasn't been home for months, and Alina is terrorized by the bombs that hit her town every day. As for Irina, the horrors she suffered in Irpin at the start of the war have plunged her into a depression from which she is struggling to escape. While training in the freezing Ukrainian winter, qualification attempts and sporting feats punctuate our story, this film is above all a breakthrough into Ukrainian society and the intimacy of athletes in wartime.

In the recovery room, the two sisters meet again after an exceptional operation : Aurélie has just given her uterus to her little sister Anaïs. Three and a half years ago, Déborah benefited from the first French uterus transplant thanks to a donation from her mother. She is now expecting her second child. After the success of the first two transplants, they are already preparing the next one. Crossed portraits of these three women united by the irrepressible desire to give life.

"The city, which used to be seen as an obligatory passage for a personal coming-out, is no longer a protective space".
